There is no set layout or template for a risk assessment form and there are many versions available.

All employees have responsibilities under health and safety law to co-operate with their employer to help them comply with health and safety legislation, and also to follow any instructions and training you give regarding the measures you have in place to control health and safety risks. So if you have reviewed your risk assessments with your employees and the assessment states that employees shall wear gloves for undertaking a particular task then they have a legal duty to wear them.

Who is this training for?

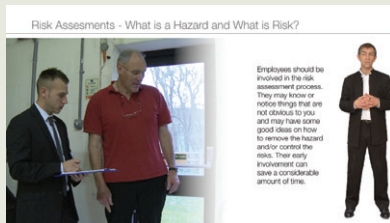

What does the course cover?

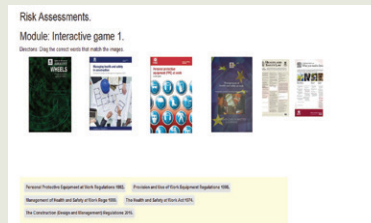
This online training course covers what is a risk and what is a hazard. What legislation is in place for risk assessing. The course also covers what the risk assessment process is and who should perform a risk assessment.

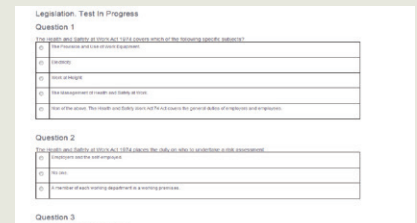
