Test probes should have a finger guard on to stop you from touching the end of the probes.

Who is this training for?

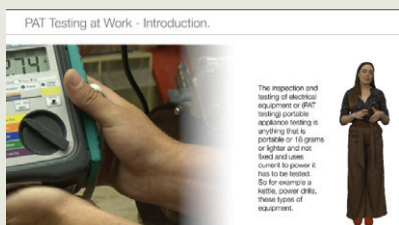

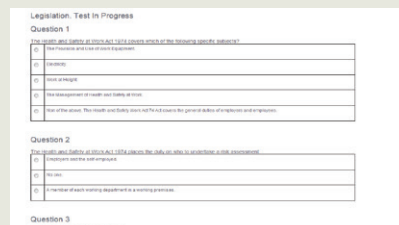
